The Ahmed Kathrada Foundation will , on the 26th of May 2011, host the Symposium -Prospects for a Non-Racial Future in South Africa. Media editors and other representatives are invited to attend.

The event will be opened by Mr Neeshan Balton, Executive Director of the Ahmed Kathrada Foundation, and moderated by Ms Barbara Creecy. Together with encouraging audience discussion, the Symposium will invite specific input from media editors, Professor David Everatt of the Gauteng City Region Observatory and Mr Leslie Dikeni of the Mapungubwe Institute for Strategic Reflection.

The Symposium is the first in a series of 'Critical Conversations', which deal with non-racialism - its meanings and interpretations - in contemporary South Africa. The Foundation's 'Critical Conversations' series aims to stimulate dialogue and debate on the issue of non-racialism in all spaces, by as wide a range of people as possible, in South Africa. This is a larger undertaking that includes community dialogues and a nation-wide focus group research project across a broad spectrum of South African people, which will culminate in the Foundation's annual lecture and related conference in October 2011.

The Ahmed Kathrada Foundation has as its key objective the deepening of non-racialism through dialogue, discussion, debate, research and history. The Foundation seeks the support and collaboration of all organisations and institutions committed to and doing work related to the building of a non-racial South Africa.
