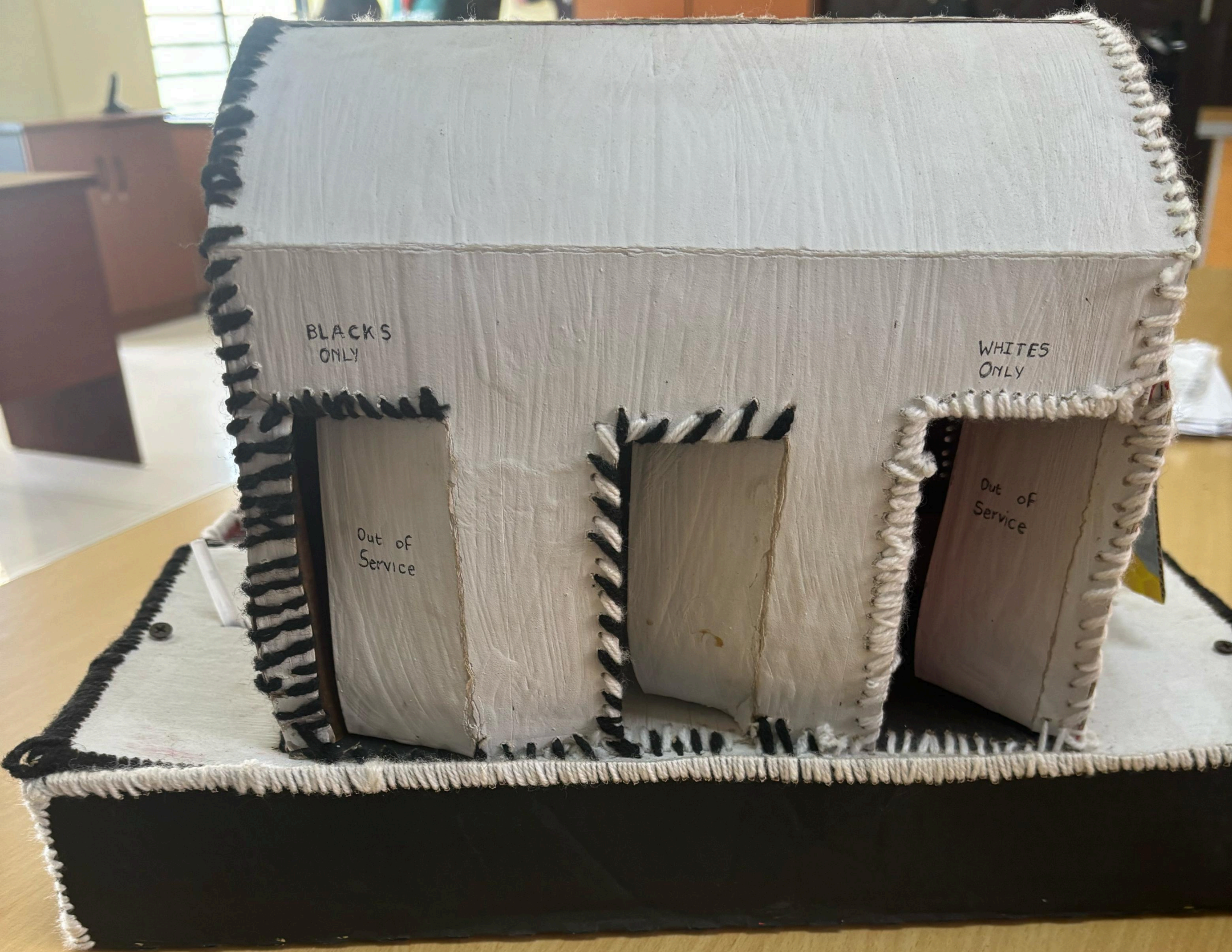

Artwork Explanation

Racism Out-of-Service (Anti-racism In-Service)

Is Blacks only toilet and whites only toilet still applicable? Not LITERALLY. This fine looking artwork is a portrayal of my Anti-racism Manifesto through the demonstration of the Blacks Only Tiolet, Whites Only Tiolet and the Universal Tiolet.

In the artwork, there are three toilets: The Blacks only Tiolet as the first, the universal Tiolet as the second and the Whites only Tiolet as the third. The Blacks only toilet is knitted with a black wool on its edges and its window to show it's for Blacks only. On the door of the toilet, there is an Out-of-Service sign, meaning that the toilet is not working. A peep through its door, there is a black floor, a white and low tiolet seat, a black roof and a wall painted in red, while the Whites only tiolet is knitted with a white wool on its edges and the windows, to show its for the whites only. On its door, there is also an Out-of-Service sign. Looking through its door, you will see the same features that are in the Blacks only Toilet. The red color in the two tiolets represent the dangers that come from racism, such as, Xenophobia, discrimination and depriving ourselves from working and uniting with other races and the black colour represents being in the dark and living in the past

But, the Universal toilet is knitted with both the white and black wool, as well as its window, to demonstrate that it is inclusive of everyone (the Blacks and the Whites). A peep through its door, you will see that the floor, the toilet seat and the roof are all white, with a combination of both the white and black wool in its inner edges while its toilet seat is higher than the other toilets. The white colour detailing of the toilet represents light, peace and access to opportunities for all races in South Africa.

This toilet distinguishes itself from the other two tiolets because of its unique features, for example, the size of the toilet, the colour of the floor, the wall, wools on its edges and the roof. The comparison of the sizes of the toilet seats symbolizes the levels of opportunities that each criteria would get.

On the right and left side of the toilets, you will see a sign written "Do Not Pee Here", a text that is common and known, just like "Do not park here". Figuratively, it implies that no one should pee anywhere outside and literally it implies that no one should practice racism otherwise they will face consequences if they urinate, such as, being arrested.

On the back of the three toilets, you will find that there are red rocks on the ground, meaning that when you pee outside you are opening old wounds of the past, such as Apartheid and segregation. It also shows that one is: 1. indential of and is against Antiracism and 2. refuses to practise Antiracism.
